## Integrated management of strategic and logistical resources

In order for our country to respond effectively to disruptions, we must manage our strategic and logistical resources in an integrated and proactive manner. This means coordinating civil and military efforts to plan, procure, store and distribute essential goods, while remaining flexible and responsive. By strengthening local production, developing strategic stocks distributed

throughout the country, and adopting circular resource management, we are reducing our external dependence and increasing our ability to respond quickly to the needs of the population.

**Objective:** To consolidate integrated and effective management of our strategic and logistical resources.



## **Key actions**



Several actions are being implemented to achieve this objective, such as:

To strategically plan and coordinate efforts:

- We develop a national management plan for logistical and strategic resources, which
  analyses the existing national framework and identifies and quantifies needs in terms
  of the acquisition, storage and distribution of essential goods and services.
- We coordinate logistical efforts between civil and military authorities in order to strengthen civil support for military activities on the one hand, and military support for civil activities on the other.
- We maintain bilateral, regional and multilateral cooperation with our European and international partners through cooperation agreements and strategic reserves at bilateral, regional and multilateral level that Luxembourg can either draw upon or contribute to.
- We establish a methodology for prioritising socio-economic categories in order to allocate resources with a given disaster or crisis scenario and the needs of different segments of the population.

To strengthen the resilience of infrastructure and operational capabilities:

- We promote decentralised and diversified distribution networks and storage sites to ensure redundant logistics supply in the event of a disaster or crisis.
- We analyse assessments of the storage capacities of critical entities and suppliers
  of essential goods in order to address any discrepancies through an appropriate
  national framework.
- We establish capacity reserves, including strategic personnel and material resources.
